No access to barns or stalls until noon on Sunday.

RULES

1. Dairy class entries close on July 15, or when all available space is filled.
Entry fee is \$10.00.
2. There will be no access to dairy barns until Noon, Sunday, July 29. Dairy cattle must be in place on the fairgrounds by July 30. Cattle will be released at 1:00 p.m. on August 1.
3. 4-H members must pay open class entry fees to exhibit in the open show.
4. Registered and qualified grade dairy cattle can be exhibited. Each animal must have official breed identification papers that verify ownership. Animals owned in partnership may be shown in one partner's name, but must show full ownership on entry.
5. No animal over two years of age will be accepted with "registration applied for" on entry form, unless purchased within 60 days of show date and entered with transfer application.
6. Animals in individual classes must be named. Specific animals in group classes do not need to be named when entries are made, but must be entered and shown in individual classes. Dams must be named on "produce of dam" entries.
7. Animals shown as bred by exhibitor must be registered as such with their official breed association. Animals bought in dam cannot be shown as bred by exhibitor.
8. Animals purchased outside the U.S. must have proof of official registry or identification with a U.S. dairy breed association.
9. Exhibitors are expected to bring their entries to the show ring when they are called to do so, and must be in the show ring with five minutes of when the class is called. Exhibitors must also supply any animal identification or health documents when asked to do so. Exhibitors who do not follow these rules may forfeit their premiums and/or be barred from exhibiting.
10. Exhibitors must show an animal in order to receive a ribbon or premium. Animals that are not exhibited will be charged \$10 per stall and may be removed from the fairgrounds.
11. Exhibitors must keep their cattle and stalls clean and presentable; manure and litter must be put in the appropriate place, as directed by show superintendent.
12. All cattle must fulfill health requirements of livestock for exhibition in the State of Iowa.
13. All fans must blow from East to West in the barns.
14. Trailers must park in designated area.
15. No painting hooves on cement floors.

OTHER:

1. The show will not break for lunch.
2. A heifer show will be held in conjunction with the 4-H dairy show on August 1. All youth between kindergarten and 12th grade who competed in the open show are eligible to participate. Entries can be made with superintendent on July 31st.
3. A judging contest will be held in the Claussen building on Monday, July 30, at 6:00 p.m. All youth, grade 12 and under, are eligible to participate. Enter by 5:45 p.m. on July 30.

DAIRY BREEDS Special Rules

1. The following birth dates will classify individual animals in the following Divisions: Guernsey/Milking Shorthorn, Jersey, Brown Swiss (SE Canton Show), Holstein, Ayrshire.

Junior Heifer Calves born after March 1, 2018 or over four months.
Intermediate Heifer Calves, born Dec. 1, 2017 & before Feb. 28, 2018.
Senior Heifer Calves, born September 1, 2017 to November 30, 2017.
Summer Yearling Heifer, born June 1, 2017 to August 31, 2017.
Junior Yearling Heifers, born March 1, 2017 to May 31, 2017.
Intermediate Yearling Heifers, born Dec. 1, 2016 to Feb. 28, 2017.
Senior Yearling Heifers, born Sept. 2016 to Nov. 30, 2016.
2 Year Old Cow, born September 1, 2015 to August 31, 2016.
3 year Old Cow, born September 1, 2015 to August 31, 2015.
4 Year Old Cow, born September 1, 2013 to August 31, 2014.
Aged Cow, 5 years & over, born before September 1, 2013.

2. Groups will be composed as follows --
Dairy Herd, 4 head, at least one cow in milk. One entry per exhibitor.
Daughter-Dam, any age, bred and owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.
Three Females, any age, bred and owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.
Cow in Milk, any age, judged on udder alone. Three entries per exhibitor.
Produce of Dam, 2 animals, any age, and produce of one cow.
3. All animals composing a Group must be shown in individual classes.
