RULES

1. Entries in this department close July 15, or whenever available space is filled.
2. All entries must be made upon entry forms or online.
3. Exhibits may be brought to the Starlite for exhibit from 6:00 P.M., Monday, July 30, till 8:00 P.M. Exhibits picked up between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m. on Monday, August 6.
4. There will be a \$1.00 entry fee required per exhibit. Please send a self- addressed stamped business size envelope to receive your entry tags.
5. Exhibitors in this department will be limited to one entry in each class.
6. All exhibits must have been grown during the current year, except corn and clover seed, which must have been grown the previous year. Any entry indicating it was not grown in the year specified, will be disqualified.
7. No ear in any sample may have more than one percent of its grains missing. All samples must be in their natural condition at both butts and tips of ears.
8. The arrangements of exhibits will be directed by the supervisor and will be classified wherever possible.
9. Exhibitors must not change their exhibits, or any part thereof, after the hour designated for the same to be in place; a violation of this rule to cause the forfeiture of any and all premiums won in this department by said exhibitor.
