**RULES**

1. Entries in this department close July 15 or until filled.
2. Entries must be made on regulation entry forms or online. Please send a (business-sized) self-addressed stamped envelope to receive your entry tags.
3. There will be a \$1.00 entry fee required per exhibit.
4. All entries must be at least 50 years old.
5. Exhibitors are limited to one entry per list, per household, with no more than five (5) from each class. Roman numerals indicate class no. Numbers indicate list no.
6. Any exhibit deemed unsuitable by the superintendent will not be accepted.
7. Entries should not weigh more than 10 pounds.
8. Entries should not be taller than 15 inches or wider than 15 inches. No exceptions.
9. Any premium may be withheld at the discretion of the judge.
10. Professionals or antique dealers and those living in the same household who sell from booths at malls or flea markets are not eligible to show.
11. Articles with entry tags attached may be brought in from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon **on Monday, July 30.** Articles may be picked up on Monday, **August 6th,** 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 NO EXCEPTIONS.
12. Exhibitors need to have claim check to pick up article on **Monday, August 7<sup>th</sup>.**
13. The management will use diligence to ensure the safety of articles after their arrival and placement, but in no case will they be responsible for a loss or damage that may occur.
14. No Blue Ribbon entries from previous years will be accepted.
