RULES

1. All entries in this department close July 1, 2018.
Absolutely no entries accepted after this day, if barns are full.
2. All entries must be made on entry blanks which are in the back of this book.
3. Entry stall fee, single \$10.00, double \$80.00. Money must accompany entry. Double stalls are limited. Only 40 available and will be assigned as entries are received.
4. To show a 6-Horse Hitch must show two halter horses.
All animals showing in Purebred Class must be registered in the Belgian Draft Horse Corporation of America. Members of one family shall be allowed to exhibit their animals together in Group and Hitch Classes as one exhibitor. This rule to apply only when horses in question are stabled and cared for as one herd on a permanent basis. These horses may be recorded, however, in the Breed Registry, in separate names of one immediate family.
5. ALL HORSES TO BE ON THE GROUNDS AND THE STALLS DECORATED BY WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 1, AT 7:00 A.M. AND REMAIN ON THE GROUNDS UNTIL COMPLETION OF ENTIRE SHOW.
HORSES CAN ONLY ARRIVE BETWEEN MIDNIGHT AND 3:00 P.M.
6. All exhibitors must decorate stalls or forfeit premium money.
7. Purebred gelding showing in Get & Produce must show registration papers.

8. Horses must be watered inside barn.
9. To accommodate halter exhibitors only - must be on grounds by 10:00 A.M., Wednesday and can leave immediately after show and must be gone by 3:00 P.M.
10. NO WOOD CHIPS FOR BEDDING. (Sawdust is OK)
11. Any exhibitor needing feed, hay or bedding, please contact Jim Whisman- Cell: 309-791-1955.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE THE CHANGES IN THE PROGRAM

1. All exhibitors wanting to plug into electricity for on-grounds camping use will be required to pay \$40.00 fee.
2. All entries must show in Pair, Unicorn, 4 Horse Hitch classes to be eligible to show in the Six Horse Hitch class.
3. Any horse shown in Class One cannot be shown in Class Two.

**HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK
AT
STATE FAIR AND DISTRICT SHOWS
SECTION 6 - HORSES AND MULES**

All horses shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual animal. Native Iowa horses and mules can be exhibited when accompanied by an individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspection listing a description of the individual animals.

All equine originating from outside the state shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection listing a description of the individual animals; and indicating that each animal six months of age and older in the shipment has had a negative official equine infectious anemia test within twelve months of importation. The testing laboratory, accession date and date of test must appear on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

THE VETERINARY INSPECTOR IN CHARGE SHALL ORDER ANY ANIMALS, POULTRY OR BIRDS, WHEN FOUND TO BE INFECTED WITH ANY CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASES, TO BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIR OR EXHIBITION.
