RULES

1. **IMPORTANT:** It is the exhibitor's responsibility to read and abide by the General Rules and Regulations.
2. All entries must be made upon entry forms provided or online. If entering online entry tags may be printed by exhibitor. If not entering online complete entry form and return it with full payment of all fees. To receive your entry tags please send a self-addressed stamped envelope with the entry.
3. All exhibits must have been grown during the current year, except corn and soybeans, which must have been grown the previous year. Any entry indicating it was not grown in the year specified, will be disqualified.
4. No ear in any sample may have more than one percent of its grains missing. All samples must be in their natural condition at both butts and tips of ears.
5. The arrangements of exhibits will be directed by the superintendent and will be classified wherever possible.
6. Exhibitors must not change their exhibits, or any part thereof, after the hour designated for the same to be in place; a violation of this rule to cause the forfeiture of all premiums won in this department by said exhibitor.
